Established in 1989, the Disaster Management Studies Centre (DMSC) conducts research across a range of theoretical and empirical aspects relating to sociological, psychological, organizational, administrative and health consequences of largescale social crisis impact. DMSC offers a series of teaching programmes leading to either an Associate or Graduate Diploma in Disaster Management. Training programmes providing short in-country courses in South-West Pacific and South-East Asia are to be conducted. DMSC has established an information clearing house facility which will assist the dissemination of disaster relevant material throughout the Asia-Pacific region. DMSC staff are available for consultant work to provide expert advice on crisis/disaster management to governments, emergency services, voluntary and/or professional agencies, and local communities.

TYPE OF TRAINING:

The Diploma Course has three major aims

- 1 To develop knowledge and understanding of concepts of social crisis and collective stress with particular reference to disaster phenomena,
- 2. To develop competence in the application of analytical and planning skills, with particular reference to formulating and implementing counter-disaster strategies;

The School's professors and technical team have considerable field experience on the subject and have done plenty of consulting work and given personal assistance during disaster (flood) events to other Brazilian States.

CANADA - Alberta Public Safety Services

NAME: Alberta Public Safety Services Training School

The Alberta Public Safety Services (APSS) Training School, which was officially opened in June 1986, is considered to be the most modern training facility of its type in Canada. The facility now provides in school training for about 2000 students every year and carries out extension courses all over the Province for a further 4000 students. Recently, the School was re-organized into two branches, a Training Delivery Branch and a Training Development Branch. The overwhelming majority of students who receive training either at the School or on extension courses are Albertans, but recently individuals from other provinces in Canada have attended courses and this trend is expected to increase in the future. The innovative Emergency Public Information Officers Course, which started as a four-day pilot course in May 1989 as part of the School's annual curriculum, emphasizes the importance of working together with the media, to seek their help and co-operation to get accurate information out quickly to the community when disaster strikes. Among training programmes which are being developed in addition to the School's existing curriculum is the on-highway dangerous goods inspectors' refresher course.

intended for public information officers trained to assume responsibility for public affairs at disaster sites (it became part of the Training School's annual curriculum in 1989);

teaching topics such as what the media need to know, how to work with the media and the public, the elements of an emergency public information plan, and how to run a news conference.

DURATION: Courses which are conducted at the School, from September to June, vary in length rom two to five days. The extension courses vary from one to four evenings.

ASIC DOCUMENTATION: Course materials Of primary importance for the School is the evelopment of the audiovisual aids which supplement the training programmes. INSIGHT, the ew publication of the Alberta Public Safety Services (APSS) - first issue in March 1989 - aims to aform readers about current developments concerning topics which relate to the mandate of APSS: to prepare for, respond to and follow up on man-made or natural disasters in Alberta. It is therefore an important tool for training activities.

The Institute of Engineering Mechanics (IEM) was initiated in 1952 and formally established in 1954 under the Academia Sinica. In 1984, the Institute was shifted to the State Seismological Bureau of China. IEM started a Programme on earthquake engineering research as early as 1955, growing up from a small group to the present status according to which most part of the Institute is devoted to earthquake engineering research in full scope, covering strong-motion seismology, seismic risk analysis, ground motion characteristics, structural dynamics, soil dynamics and earthquake resistant structures of various kinds. This Institute is well equipped with experimental facilities, computer systems and a comprehensive library for disaster mitigation research.

Crisis seminars and workshops

Preventing and coping with industrial crisis requires innovative corporate policies, new managerial skills, changes in government policies and community action. Custom designed seminars are offered for corporate, government and community groups to help them develop crisis coping capabilities. Seminars focus on assessment of their crisis environment, potential triggering events, crisis processes and crisis management procedures. Custom tailored workshops are designed for training corporate Executives in crisis management techniques.

• Consultation service on appropriate drug and medical supplies for immediate and intermediate release in disasters

Interchurch Medical Assistance, Inc. is the medical materials resource for Church World Service of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the US. Through this service, IMA is in constant contact with CWS's Disaster Relief office and Material Resources Programme immediately following each natural disaster. Materials at hand in its inventory and special acquisitions of recommended materials are constantly reviewed during those early days for appropriateness and management issues.

Similar services are provided to Adventist Development and Relief Agency, International, Lutheran World Relief and Mennonite Central Committee. In addition, these

and several mission boards are called upon to replenish destroyed inventories of some hospitals. During these intermediate, rehabilitation experiences, IMA provides consultation on priorities, appropriateness, as well as sources for intermediate assistance.

• Consultation in appropriate materials for pre-disaster storage.

Executive Director has previous experience as Director of Disaster Response for a significantly large mission board for ten years. Executive Director and Associate Executive Director have both served IMA for 9 years in its materials storage for appropriate response. Associate Executive Director has experience in computer managed inventory control. Offered is direct consultation, based on that experience, in decision making on what can and/or should be stored in certain disaster prone areas and the difficulties in storage without rotation of other materials

DURATION: Offered is direct consultation for the direct time it may take, as half-day to one day. Also offered is on site consultation if deemed appropriate, for what ever time is necessary, but certainly less than a week.

IOC established in 1968 an International Co-ordination Group for the Tsunami Warning System in the Pacific (ICG/ITSU) which meets every two years. IOC maintains the International Tsunami Information Center (ITIC), which is responsible for monitoring the international tsunami warning activities in the Pacific and for recommending improvements with regard to communications, data networks, data acquisition, and information dissemination; bringing to Member and non-member States information on tsunami warning systems; assisting Member States of ITSU in the establishment of national warning systems and improving preparedness for tsunamis for all nations throughout the Pacific Ocean; and gathering and promulgating knowledge on tsunamis as well as forecasting tsunami research and its application to prevent loss of life and damage to property.

The Team is part of the British Association of Immediate Care Schemes (BASICS) and is partly funded by the South Manchester Health Authority and charitable donations. The staff are National Health Service employees, but give their time to the Rescue Team as an extra voluntary duty. The members of the Team are actively involved in the UK initiative to establish a disaster coordination centre to facilitate the co-ordination of rescue facilities throughout the UK and to assist in sending medical teams and rescue workers abroad.
